'Lead Schools for Music' Opportunity - Applications Now Open!

Please see the message below from Claire Nichols (Teaching and Learning Manager at Nottingham Music Hub), along with the attached information pack:

I am emailing with the exciting announcement that applications are now open for our **'Lead Schools for Music' opportunity**. In response to the National Plan for Music, The Department for Education, alongside Arts Council England, have asked all music hubs to appoint lead schools for music in each. Nottingham Music Service is therefore looking to broaden its work with educators, by developing partnerships within City schools, facilitating the development of support and resources, including coverage of the Curriculum, Co-curricular and extra-curricular in music.

We know that some fantastic music provision and teaching is happening across the City and we are keen to appoint schools demonstrating an exemplary commitment to musical teaching and learning. Working with Lead Schools will further allow us to:

- help other schools in the area to make music teaching better
- look for new and better ways for teachers to support each other and work together
- help Hubs to understand what schools need and work better with them

Being keen to ensure that the Lead Schools reflect the needs of all the schools we work with, we welcome and encourage applications from Primary, Secondary and Special schools, within the Nottingham City boundary. The appointed schools will be co-deliverers with the local Music Service to support stronger links between schools and academy trusts, and broker opportunities for peer-to-peer learning in music education.
