<u>Dramatherapy in education: supporting emotional, social and psychological</u> development through story, play and movement

A branch of psychotherapy that helps develop emotional, behavioural and psychological resilience, dramatherapy supports young people in building social skills, self-esteem and confidence.

Dramatherapy as an individual or group intervention can promote trust and empowerment, helping young people feel heard and valued. It encourages imagination and reflection on feelings and experiences.

Dramatherapy can also help children to communicate appropriately and foster relationships with others, developing identity, autonomy and easing difficult transitions.

A dramatherapy practitioner with more than twenty years' experience, Kez McClelland BA (Hons) MA develops and delivers therapeutic provisions across a variety of education settings, supporting staff and young people with the broadest range of needs.

Dramatherapy supports young people who experience bereavement and loss, parental divorce and separation, bullying, adopted or 'looked-after' children, attachment difficulties, eating disorders, self-harm, emotional, social and behavioural difficulties.

Classical Music - Schools' Consultation Workshops

MishMash Productions conduct regular youth consultation workshops across the Midlands to assess young people's perceptions of classical music.
