Dear colleagues

I hope you are well.

The next round of the FREE Health and Wellbeing Survey is happening from September to mid-November. To be involved you need to register (even if you took part last year) <u>https://sheu.org.uk/register</u>

The survey is aimed at years 6 and 10 but can also be completed by other year groups. It gives invaluable data about a range of health-related behaviours, including mental health, vaping, healthy eating and physical activity. The survey can be completed on hard copy or online and all analysis is completed by the survey company SHEU. Each school receives an individual report with their own data and comparisons to City-wide data. The more schools that take part the richer this data will be. For more information see our website

Schools that are planning to work towards the <u>Achieve Well Health and Wellbeing Awards</u> need to complete the survey.

I encourage you to make use of this FREE survey tool as the data will be so useful for planning to meet the needs of pupils. The survey is currently funded for three years, this is the second year.
