

# Lead Mentor Role for NTU: Briefing Session: 3<sup>rd</sup> March 3.30 on TEAMS

NST colleagues have been working with Nottingham Trent University to support changes they have made to their ITE. Part of the change involves the quality assurance of the mentoring of trainees in schools and the introduction of **Lead Mentors**.

**Lead Mentor** is a new role that started this academic year and is a DFE requirement of ITE that ensures that mentors of trainees in schools have someone to support and coach them throughout the mentoring process. A **Lead Mentor** visits schools and carries out joint observations of trainees with mentors and provide support and coaching to the mentor in order to develop high quality mentoring, feedback and progress reports.

This is a very exciting opportunity for colleagues within schools who have completed or are currently completing the NPQLT or NPQLTD or someone who is an experienced mentor of trainees, as this role enables them to use their knowledge and skills gained from these programmes.

**Funding is provided to schools at the SLE rate of £350 per day** for the release time of a Lead Mentor to carry out this role and training is also provided so that Lead Mentors have a deep knowledge of ITE and NTU curriculum.

Colleagues that are interested in this role will have to submit an expression of interest to NTU detailing their experience that demonstrates their suitability for the Lead Mentor role.

The very wonderful Alison Carter from Southglade has been fulfilling this role this year and has arranged a briefing session for any staff who may be interested on the **3**<sup>rd</sup> **March at 3.30 on TEAMS.** During this session Alison will talk through the role and how to send in your expression of interest. Please pass onto any staff who may be interested and encourage them to join us to find out more about it.

- Spring Term 2025 Pupil Premium Plus Arrangements: PLEASE NOTE SHORT DEADLINE- Schools requiring Pupil Premium Plus for Nottingham City looked after children of statutory school age during the Spring Term must add details of the intervention to the pupil's Spring ePEP and ensure the relevant funding option is selected by Friday 14th February 2025. The Pupil Premium Plus grant is given to Virtual Schools on a financial year basis (1 April 2024 to 31 March 2025). Nottingham City Virtual School needs to finalise Spring Term Pupil Premium Plus requests before commencing the annual statutory financial closedown process. Any Pupil Premium Plus and Additional Funding applications received after 1 April 2025 relating to the 2024/2025 financial year cannot be considered under the DFE's statutory Pupil Premium Plus guidance. After 14th February 2025, the next opportunity to apply is between April and July 2025. ## Primary Education Network (PEN) Invitation - Thursday 06.03.25 (Online)

Dear Colleagues,

Free online professional development events: The University of Nottingham's Primary Education Network for 2024-25

We hope that Spring Term is going well.

For some years, our partnership work has included the Primary Education Network (PEN). This is an opportunity for school colleagues to come together for free events that offer both professional development and local networking. In the past, meetings have focused on topics such as memory, refugee education and the use of technology to support children's writing.

The current format is an hour's online session (MS Teams) featuring some expert input and the opportunity for questions and discussion afterwards.

This term's event focuses on creating a diverse, representative primary curriculum and will be led by Helen Richardson, Deputy Headteacher at Seely Primary and Nursery School:

What happens when children in your primary classroom do not see themselves represented in your curriculum?

In this session we will discuss the impact of the lack of representation in the primary curriculum, the importance of including everyone's history in the primary curriculum and how to create a diverse curriculum where everyone is included. We will look at why it's not enough to teach our children to be tolerant, but the entire basis of our curricula should be shaping accepting and respectful citizens of the future.

This event will take place online, through MS Teams on **Thursday 6 March**, **from 4pm-5pm**. If you would like to come, please indicate by clicking on one of the following links and we will send you an invitation and link.
