#### Nottingham Attendance Strategy – Inclusive Attendance Bronze KITE Mark Programme

Please find attached details of the Inclusive Attendance Nottingham Bronze KITE Mark programme, details of which were shared at the PEIA Attendance Conference on 28<sup>th</sup> February.

This exclusive programme spans three half-day sessions, each lasting three hours, culminating in an online assessment to meet the Bronze KITE Mark standard. What the Programme Offers:

- Expert advice and guidance through each stage of the Four-Stage Implementation Programme.
- Networking opportunities for schools to collaborate and share best practices across all four stages.
- Guaranteed achievement of the Bronze KITE Mark standard by the end of the programme.
- Surpassing expectations set in the Ofsted 2025 framework and the DfE's statutory attendance guidelines.

The price of the programme for Nottingham Schools is £450, we are waiting for confirmation that Nottingham City will make a contribution of £100 per school which would make the final cost £350.

The price is based on at least 30 schools signing up and we need a response before the end of March please so that we can arrange dates and venues for the 3 face to face workshops included in the programme

# Are you looking for high quality music provision to enrich your curriculum and community?

I am Catrin Jones, a very experienced and enthusiastic UPS teacher of primary music and singing, and I am available for work in schools a day per week, ideally on a Tuesday.

I have been working as Music teacher and Co-ordinator at Greenfields Community School in the Meadows for the past eleven years and have played an integral part in establishing the school's reputation for high quality music provision. Music is at the heart of the school. This has led to Greenfields being awarded 'Lead School status for Music' (2024-2026), specialising in singing. The whole school learns to sing and play music in languages and styles which proudly reflect our diverse and rich culture in Nottingham.

I have an energetic and creative approach to classroom music, inspiring children to develop confidence, knowledge and musical skills on a wide variety of instruments including djembe, xylophones, steel pans, percussion, clarinets and keyboards. We have nurtured a love of music in the children through performing and creating together, individually, in classes and as a whole school.

I am also currently working in partnership with the Focused Provision for the Deaf at Mellers Primary School, teaching singing and sign language, from ages 3-11. This includes leading our singing and signing choir and collaborating on our bespoke dramatic productions.

Previously, I was Head of Primary Music at the British School of Milan for 4 years and worked as Vocal Lead for the Nottingham City Music Service for 11 years.
